# STATE OF MAINE.

**RESOLVE** in favor of Arthur L. Grant of Hermon.

Resolved, That there be paid to Arthur L. Grant 2 of Hermon, in the county of Penobscot, out of any 3 money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, 4 the sum of six dollars per month, commencing on 5 the first day of January, eighteen hundred and 6 eighty-three, and continuing during the pleasure of 7 the legislature, instead of the sum now provided by 8 law.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The evidence before the committee shows that Arthur L. Grant of Hermon is a man of good character and good habits; that previous to 1842 he had his leg broken while in the military service of the State of Maine, at a military muster duly called by proper authority, whereby he was permanently disabled; that he is now suffering from this injury, and is old and poor and needy. He first received a pension in 1842, which has since been renewed from time to time by act of Legislature.
