STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Kingsbury.

Resolved, That the town of Kingsbury be paid
2 out of the funds in the treasury the sum of six
3 hundred dollars in full of all damages against the
4 state of Maine for the support of state paupers
5 from eighteen hundred and seventy-four, to the
6 present, as set forth in a petition of the selectmen
7 for support of John Leishon and family to the
8 amount of nine hundred and forty-eight dollars;
9 also Thomas Holms and family, to the amount of
10 forty-five dollars.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Prior to 1874 the town of Kingsbury had in their town a State pauper and family supported by the State. After 1874 this town expended for the support of this pauper, "John Leishon," and his family, consisting of himself, wife and eleven children, the sum of \$948.00. In 1879 the Legislature voted to pay this town \$400 for the claim. The town refused to accept this and now present their claim again, asking the State to reimburse simply what they paid out years ago.
