STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of New Canada Plantation.

Resolved, That there be paid by the treasurer of 2 the state, out of the school fund, to the Plantation 3 of New Canada, in Aroostook county, on the 4 second day of July, eighteen hundred and eighty-5 three, the sum of fifty-eight dollars; provided, due 6 school returns are previously made to the superin-7 tendent of common schools.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The assessors of plantation New Canada, in Aroostook county, made regular and due return, according to law, of the number of scholars in said plantation on the 1st day of April last, to the superintendent of common schools. The said report, from some cause unknown and through no fault or neglect of theirs, has never been received at the office of the State superintendent. The said plantation has raised and expended for common schools the sum required by law, and ask that the amount to which they are by law entitled, and which they have not received, may be granted them.
