STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-THREE

AN ACT to amend sections one and three of chapter seven of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-five.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. Section one of said chapter is hereby
2 amended so as to read as follows :

3 *Sect. 1.* All persons who now are or may here-
4 after become inmates of the national home for
5 disabled volunteer soldiers at Togus, in the county
6 of Kennebec, or subject to the rules and regula-
7 tions thereof, or shall receive rations therefrom,
8 shall have their pauper settlement in the respective
9 towns in which they had a legal settlement when
10 their connection with said national home com-

11 menced, so long as such connection shall continue
12 therewith.

SECT. 2. Section three of said chapter is hereby
2 amended so as to read as follows:

3 *Sect. 3.* If any town shall furnish relief to any
4 such person, or his family, who shall become a
5 pauper after his connection with said national
6 home shall cease, having no legal settlement in
7 this state, the state shall reimburse such town for
8 the relief furnished, to such an amount as the
9 governor and council shall adjudge to have been
10 necessarily expended therefor.
