## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE.

AN ACT relating to compensation of the warden, clerk and guards at the state prison.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The salary of the warden of the state prison shall

- 2 be two thousand dollars, with the use without
- 3 charge of such part of the keeper's house, and
- 4 buildings of the state appurtenant to the prison
- 5 and yard, as the governor and council may direct,
- 6 and fuel for his use; which shall be in full for all
- 7 services including the duty of receiving and paying
- 8 out money for all purposes.
- 9 The salary of the clerk shall be seven hundred 10 and fifty dollars.

11 The salaries of the guards in the state prison 12 shall be not less than four hundred and fifty dol-13 lars nor more than five hundred and fifty dollars a 14 year, according to the length of service and 15 efficiency of the person serving as guard, to be 16 determined by the warden, instead of five hundred 17 dollars as now provided by law.
