STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend section four of chapter sixty-one of the revised statutes, relating to the liabilities of married women.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section four of chapter sixty-one of the revised

- 2 statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the
- 3 word "purpose" in the fourth line thereof, the
- 4 words "neither is he liable for her torts committed:
- 5 after April twenty-six, eighteen hundred and
- 6 eighty-three, in which he takes no part"; also by
- 7 striking out the word "both" in the same line and
- 8 inserting instead thereof, the words "all such";
- 9 also by inserting after the word "debts" in the

- 10 seventh line thereof, the words "and for damages
- 11 for such torts"; so that the same section, amended,
- 12 shall be as follows:
- 13 Sect. 4. A husband married since April twenty-
- 14 six, eighteen hundred and fifty-two, is not liable for
- 15 the debts of his wife contracted before marriage,
- 16 nor for those contracted afterward in her own
- 17 name, for any lawful purpose; neither is he liable
- 18 for her torts committed after April twenty-six,
- 19 eighteen hundred and eighty-three, in which he
- 20 takes no part; but she is liable in all such cases, a
- 21 suit may be maintained against her, or against her
- 22 and her husband therefor, and her property may be
- 23 attached and taken on execution for such debts and
- 24 for damages for such torts, as if she were sole, but
- 25 she cannot be arrested.
