STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend section five, chapter twenty-eight of the revised statutes (Goddard's Revision).

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section five, chapter twenty-eight, revised stat-2 utes (Goddard's Revision), is hereby amended by 3 adding thereto the words, "and all intoxicating 4 liquors of whatever kind, found on the premises of 5 druggists or apothecaries, shall be held to be 6 intended for sale in violation of law, except in 7 quantities judged to be reasonable for the needs 8 of their legitimate business," so that said section 9 as amended shall read as follows:

10 Sect. 5. Apothecaries, registered as herein 11 provided, shall have the right to keep, under such 12 restrictions as the legislature may impose, all 13 medicines and poisons authorized by the United 14 States dispensatory and pharmacopœa as of recog-15 nized medicinal utility; *provided*, that nothing 16 herein contained shall be so construed as to au-17 thorize the sale of intoxicating liquors, and all 18 intoxicating liquors of whatever kind, found on the 19 premises of druggists or apothecaries, shall be 20 held to be intended for sale in violation of law 21 except in quantities judged to be reasonable for 22 the needs of their legitimate business.
