## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend sections fifteen and sixteen of chapter forty-eight of the revised statutes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Section fifteen of said chapter is 2 amended so as to read as follows:
- 3 No child less than twelve years old can be
- 4 employed or suffered to work in a cotton or woolen
- 5 manufactory; if over twelve and under fifteen, he
- 6 shall not be so employed without having attended
- 7 a public school, or a private one taught by a person
- 8 qualified to be a public teacher, three months of
- 9 the twelve, next preceding such employment, in
- 10 each year. A certificate under oath of such

- 11 teacher, filed with the clerk or agent before 12 employment, is to constitute the proof of such 13 schooling.
  - SECT. 2. Any owner, agent or superintendent of 2 such manufactory, for each violation of the preced-3 ing section, forfeits fifty dollars, to be recovered 4 by indictment, one-half to the prosecutor and the 5 other to the town where the offence was committed, 6 to be added to its school money. It is the duty of 7 the school committee of the several towns to 8 inquire into such violations and report them to a
- 9 county attorney, who, on reception thereof, shall 10 prosecute therefor.
