STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend section three, of chapter one hundred and forty-seven, of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-three, relating to the appointment of port wardens.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. The third section of chapter one hundred and forty-seven of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-three, entitled "an act providing for the appointment of port wardens," is hereby amended by striking out in the last two lines of said section the words, "and the vacancy thereby created shall be filled by the aforesaid appointing powers until the next annual meeting," and inserting in place thereof the following words:

11 “ And all vacancies, whether created by removal
12 “ or caused by death, resignation, inability or any
13 “ other cause, shall be filled by the aforesaid
14 “ appointing powers.”

15 So that said section as amended, shall read as
16 follows:

17 *Sect. 3.* Said boards of trade, by their man-
18 agers, and said municipal officers, by themselves,
19 shall have the power, and they are hereby respec-
20 tively required to remove for cause, forthwith,
21 upon complaint of any person aggrieved, and after
22 hearing the party or parties complained of, any
23 port warden or port wardens by them appointed,
24 and all vacancies, whether created by removal or
25 caused by death, resignation, inability or any other
26 cause, shall be filled by the aforesaid appointing
27 powers.
