STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE making appropriations for Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians for the years of eighteen hundred and eighty-three and eighteen hundred and eighty-four.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury, to be expended under the direction of the governor and council, to the agent of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians for the benefit of said tribe, for the years of eighteen hundred and eighty-three and eighteen hundred and eighty-four, as follows:

8 For May dividends, four hundred dollars each
9 year; for November dividends, three hundred dol-
10 lars each year; for distressed poor, two thousand
11 dollars each year; for agricultural purposes, six
12 hundred dollars each year; for bounty on crops,
13 three hundred dollars each year; for ploughing,

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14 one hundred and fifty dollars each year; for sala-
15 ries of governors, one hundred dollars each year;
16 for salaries of lieutenant governors, forty dollars
17 each year; for wood, two hundred dollars each
18 year; for contingent expenses, one hundred dollars
19 each year; for educational purposes, six hundred
20 dollars each year, to be expended under the super-
21 vision of the agent of said tribe and the resident
22 priest; for salary of priest, one hundred dollars
23 each year; for dressing for land, one hundred
24 dollars each year; for salary of agent, two hundred
25 dollars each year; for contingent poor fund, five
26 hundred dollars each year.
