STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and fiftytwo of the special laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-one, entitled "an act to provide schools for the training of teachers in Madawaska territory."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section two, chapter one hundred 2 and fifty-two of the special laws of eighteen hun-3 dred and eighty-one, is hereby amended, to read 4 as follows:

5 Sect. 2. To defray the expenses of said schools
6 the sum of thirteen hundred dollars is hereby
7 appropriated in the manner hereinafter provided.
8 The treasurer of the state shall annually deduct
9 from any of the school moneys raised by the state

10 for the support of common schools, the sum of 11 seven hundred dollars; and from the gross amount 12 of the state school funds of all descriptions annu-13 ally apportioned to the towns of Grand Isle, 14 Frenchville, Madawaska, Fort Kent and Van Bu-15 ren, and to the plantations of Hamlin, Connor, 16 Cyr, Saint Francis, Saint John, Wallagrass and 17 Eagle Lake, the sum of six hundred dollars; which 18 sums shall remain in the treasury subject to the 19 order of the governor and council for the payment 20 of the expenses of said schools, the bills for which 21 shall be approved by the state superintendent of 22 common schools, and audited by the governor and 23 council.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when ap-2 proved.
