STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Committee on State College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts, state that they have visited the institution, that they have had several hearings, and made a thorough investigation into the wants thereof, and recommend an appropriation of thirteen thousand dollars to be expended as follows for necessities of the college for the next two years, tabulated as follows :

To pay the debt incurred during the last two years	\$2,000 00
For instruction, \$2,500 per year....	5,000 00
To build and equip a shop.....	2,800 00
For gas apparatus.....	1,000 00
Experiments, \$250 per year.....	500 00
Apparatus for the several departments	500 00
Repairs.....	300 00
Insurance.....	600 00
Travelling expenses of Trustees....	300 00
Total.....	<hr/> \$13,000 00

And ask leave to report the accompanying resolve and that the same ought to pass.

RESOLVE in favor of the Maine State College of
Agriculture and Mechanic Arts.

Resolved, That the sum of thirteen thousand dol-
2 lars be and the same is hereby appropriated for the
3 purpose of paying for instruction and contingent
4 expenses of the Maine State College of Agriculture
5 and Mechanic Arts, for the years eighteen hundred
6 and eighty-three, and eighteen hundred and eighty-
7 four, as specified in the report of the joint stand-
8 ing committee on the Maine State College of Agri-
9 culture and Mechanic Arts, of which sum sixty-
10 five hundred dollars may be paid out of the state
11 treasury during the year eighteen hundred and
12 eighty-three, and sixty-five hundred dollars during
13 the year eighteen hundred and eighty-four, under
14 the direction of the governor and council.
