STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend chapter fifty-seven, section sixth
of the public laws of the state of Maine, relating to
tolls for grinding grain.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. Section six of chapter fifty-seven of
2 the public laws of the state of Maine, be amended
3 by striking out the words "except buckwheat and
4 India wheat," and such part of said section as re-
5 lates to the same, so it will read when amended.

SECT. 2. The toll for grinding, cleansing and
2 bolting all kinds of grain, shall not exceed one-
3 sixteenth part thereof.
