## SIXTY-FIRST LEGISLATURE.

SENATE. No. 53.

The subscribers, being a minority of the Committee on Legislative Apportionment, to which was referred the apportionment of one hundred and fifty-one representatives among the several counties, cities, towns, plantations and classes in the State of Maine, have had the same under consideration, and ask leave to submit the following report:

So far as the apportionment is therein made between counties, and except as to the counties of Cumberland, Sagadahoc, Kennebee and Somerset, we concur in the report of the majority. For the excepted counties, we submit the following report:

The County of Cumberland shall choose twenty-one representatives, to be apportioned as provided in the majority report, except that Brunswick shall choose two.

The County of Sagadahoc shall choose five representatives, to be apportioned as provided in the majority report, except that Bath shall choose two.

The County of Kennebec shall choose twelve representatives, to be apportioned as follows: Augusta, two; Gardiner, one; Waterville, one; Winthrop, Mt. Vernon and Belgrade, one; Wayne, Fayette, Monmouth and Litchfield, one; West Waterville, Rome, Vienna and Readfield, one; Vassalboro', Sidney and Manchester, one; Hallowell and Windsor, one; Albion, China, Chelsea and Unity plantation, one; Benton, Clinton and Winslow, one; Pittston, West Gardiner and Farmingdale, one.

The County of Somerset shall choose seven representatives, to be apportioned as follows: Pittsfield, Palmyra and St.

Albans, one; Skowhegan and Cornville, one; Detroit, Cambridge, Ripley, Canaan, Hartland and Harmony, one; Fairfield, Smithfield and Mercer, one; Brighton, Athens, Madison, Solon and Mayfield, one; Norridgewock, Starks, Anson and Embden, one; Bingham, New Portland, Lexington, Moscow, Concord, and all other territory in Somerset County, not included in any other district, one.
