## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE.

AN ACT relating to support of persons having no pauper settlement in the state and removing from unincorporated places into towns.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. When persons residing in any un-2 incorporated place in the state, and having no 3 pauper settlement in the state, remove from such 4 unincorporated place to any town in which such 5 persons have never resided before such removal, 6 and then need relief, and the same is furnished to 7 them by such town, the state shall reimburse the 8 town for such relief so furnished, in the same 9 manner and under the same restrictions as pro-10 vided in section twenty-two of chapter twenty11 four of the revised statutes, and acts amendatory 12 of, and additional to said section, in relation to 13 supplies furnished to persons having no settle-14 ment in the state residing in places not incorpo-15 rated.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when ap-2 proved.
