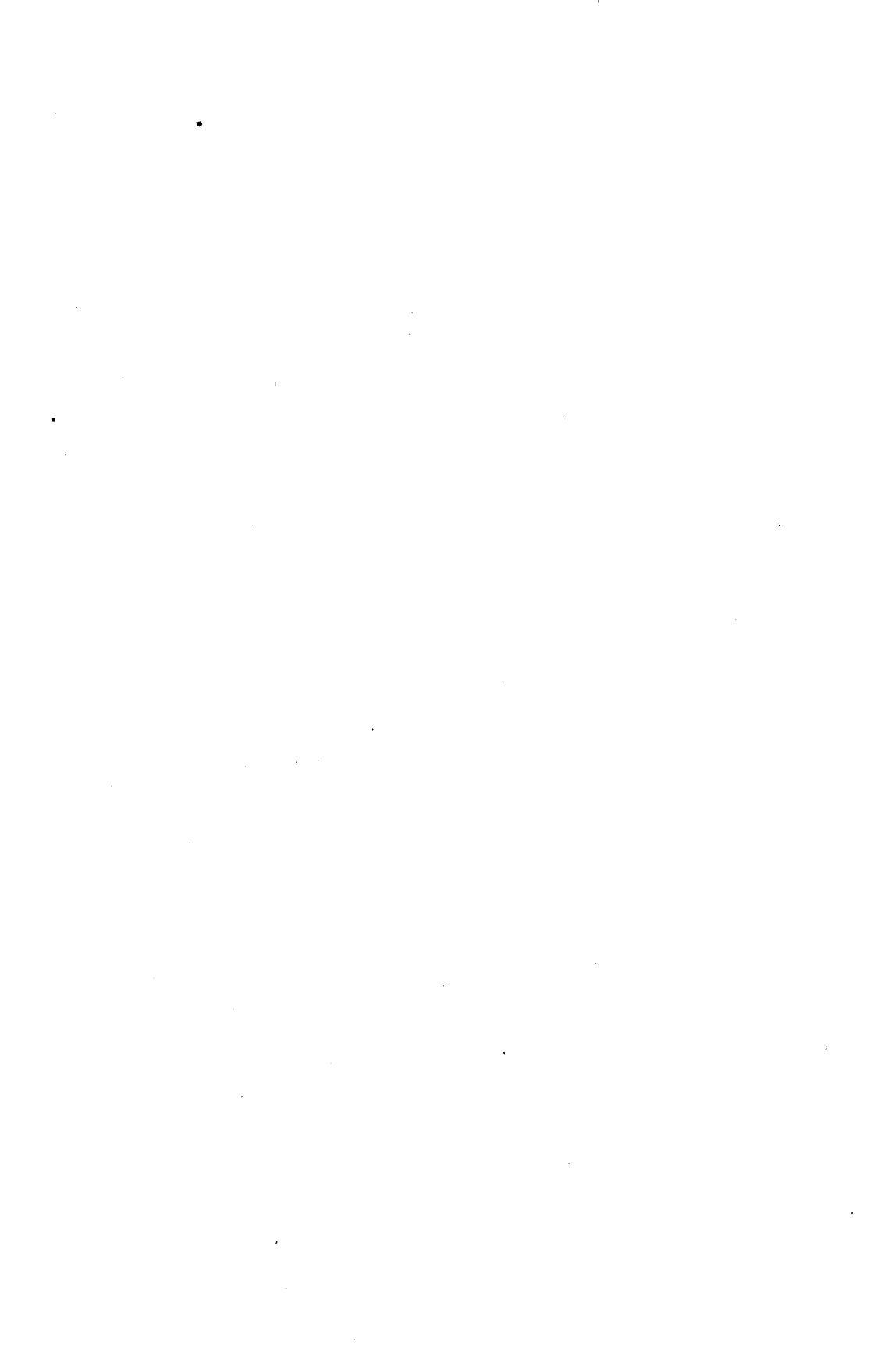
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-THREE.

AN ACT to authorize a lien on preserved corn or
other grain or fruit.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. Whoever furnishes corn or other
2 grain or fruit for canning, or preservation other-
3 wise, shall have a lien on such preserved article for
4 its value when delivered, including the cans, and
5 other vessels containing the same and the cases,
6 for thirty days after the same has been delivered,
7 and until it has been shipped on board a vessel or
8 car, and may be enforced by attachment within
9 that time.

SECT. 2. The provisions of section thirty-six of
2 chapter ninety-one of the revised statutes shall
3 apply to this act.
