STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-THREE.

AN ACT in relation to the settlement of persons
living in unincorporated places.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Whenever any person, having a pauper settlement
2 in a town, has lived or shall have lived five years
3 in any unincorporated place or places in the state,
4 such person and those who derive their settlement
5 from him shall be deemed to have lost their settle-
6 ment in such town.
