STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Bath Military and Naval Orphan Asylum.

Resolved, That the sum of thirteen hundred dol-

- 2 lars be appropriated to the Bath Military and Naval
- 3 Orphan Asylum to pay outstanding bills incurred
- 4 in the support of the asylum to the thirty-first day
- 5 of December, eighteen hundred and eighty-two;
- 6 and also the heirs of Jeremiah Robinson and Wil-
- 7 liam D. Crooker, for use of land adjoining the
- 8 asylum and used for the purposes of the asylum
- 9 during the last ten years, the sum of six hundred
- 10 and fifty dollars, the bills and claims to be audited
- 11 and allowed by the governor and council.

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A."

Strike out word "use" in tenth line and insert 2 "good and sufficient warranty deed," and strike 3 out in twelfth line the words "six hundred and 4 fifty dollars" and insert the words "twelve hun-5 dred dollars."

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

There are unsettled bills for provisions, clothing, etc., amounting to not less than \$1,300, (ending Dec. 31, 1882,) previous appropriations not having been sufficient to meet the needs of the institution.

There is due the heirs of Robinson & Crooker, according to the agreement made by the Military Committee, the sum of twelve hundred dollars, for land occupied by said institution, for use of land on which stand the stable for the institution, and for which rent has never been paid.
