STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT additional to chapter one hundred and
thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, relating to trials
before magistrates.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. In all hearings before municipal or
2 police courts or trial justices, the respondent may
3 plead not guilty, and waive a hearing, whereupon the
4 same proceedings shall be had as to sentence and
5 appeal as if there had been a full hearing.
