RESOLVE making an appropriation for repairs of roads in Indian Township, Washington County.

Resolved, That the sum of eight hundred dollars
2 be and is hereby appropriated for the year eighteen
3 hundred and eighty-five, and five hundred dollars
4 for the year eighteen hundred and eighty-six to
5 be expended under the direction of the Governor
6 and Council upon the Houlton and Baring road
7 and the road leading from said Houlton and Bar-
8 ing road to Grand Lake Stream in Indian Town-
9 ship, Washington County.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Houlton and Baring road, through Indian Township, eight miles long, a direct mail route from Forest Station, on the Maine Central Railroad, to Princeton and the Grand Lake Stream road, four miles long; also a daily mail route, leading from Princeton to Grand Lake Stream in Hinkley Township, Washington County, are in a bad condition; the State appropriation for the past two years having been insufficient to keep said roads in suitable repair, sufficient only to repair the worst places. The above roads are situated, mostly, on low, level land, with a great scarcity of gravel or any good material for building roads.
