STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT to incorporate the Provident Aid Society.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION. 1. That Frederick Fox, Joseph E.

- 2 Moore, Franklin J. Rollins, Everett Smith, Ed-
- 3 mund Dana, Edward C. Goodnow, James L.
- 4 Stoddard, John B. Cotton, Payson Tucker, their
- 5 associates, successors and assigns, be and hereby
- 6 are made a body politic and corporate by the name
- 7 of the Provident Aid Society, for benevolent pur-
- 8 poses, and furnishing aid and relief by means of
- 9 mutual agreements, guarantees and payments of
- 10 funds; and the said corporation may sue and be
- 11 sued, defend and be defended, have and use a

- 12 common seal, and establish all by-laws and regu-
- 13 lations which may be necessary to carry out the
- 14 purposes of this corporation.
 - SECT. 2. Said corporation may purchase, take,
 - 2 and hold, by deed, gift, bequest, devise, or other-
 - 3 wise, real and personal estate, for the purposes of
 - 4 said corporation, to the amount of fifty thousand
 - 5 dollars in value.
 - SECT. 3. The first five persons named in this
 - 2 act may call the first meeting of this corporation
 - 3 by mailing a notice therefor to each corporator at
 - 4 least seven days before said meeting.
 - Sect. 4. The provisions of chapter forty-nine of
 - 2 the Revised Statutes of Maine shall not apply to
 - 3 this act, excepting that the business and condition
 - 4 of this society shall be subject to the examination
 - 5 of the Insurance Commissioner, according to the
 - 6 provisions of sections seventy-nine and eighty of
 - 7 said chapter forty-nine, Revised Statutes of Maine.
 - SECT. 5. The act shall take effect upon approval 2 by the Governor.
