STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT to extend the exemption of wages for personal labor from attachment by trustee process.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Article six of section fifty-five, chapter eighty-six
2 of the Revised Statutes, is hereby amended by strik-
3 ing out from the fifth and sixth lines the words
4 "and this is not exempt in any suit for necessaries
5 furnished him or his family," so that the same as
6 amended will read as follows:

'Sixth.—By reason of any amount due from him
8 to the principal defendant, as wages for his per-
9 sonal labor, or that of his wife or minor children,
10 for a time not exceeding one month next preceding

11 the service of the process, and not exceeding
12 twenty dollars of the amount due to him as wages
13 for his personal labor; moreover, wages of minor
14 children and of women are not, in any case, sub-
15 ject to trustee process on account of any debt of
16 parent or husband.'
