STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in aid of Oak Grove Seminary.

Resolved, That the sum of six hundred dollars be
2 and hereby is appropriated to aid in defraying the
3 expenses of Oak Grove Seminary, in the town of
4 Vassalboro', of which there shall be paid the sum
6 of three hundred dollars in eighteen hundred and
7 eighty-five, and three hundred dollars in eighteen
8 hundred and eighty-six.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The school building known as Oak Grove Seminary, in the town of Vassalboro', was burned in the winter of 1882, including valuable furniture and apparatus, involving a loss of five thousand dollars. Not being any insurance on this property, the loss falls heavily on the friends of the institution. The boarding house connected with the school was saved, and together with the land connected, is now owned by the "New England Yearly Meeting of Friends." This society will rebuild the school building the present year, and the sum of four thousand dollars is already pledged for this purpose. The school with fifty pupils is now carried on in the boarding house, and the sum indicated in the accompanying resolve is to defray the expenses of the school during the next two years.
