STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT amendatory to section twenty-nine of
chapter ninety-one of the Revised Statutes, to
create a lien on wood.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section twenty-nine of chapter
2 ninety-one of the Revised Statutes is hereby
3 amended by adding after the word "bark" in the
4 first line the words 'or cutting cord wood,' and by
5 adding after the word "bark" in the fifth line the
6 words 'or wood,' so that said section as amended
7 shall read as follows, viz:

SECT. 29. Whoever labors at cutting and piling hem-
2 lock bark or cutting cord wood has a lien thereon

3 for the amount due for his personal services, which
4 takes precedence of all other claims, continues for
5 thirty days, and may be enforced by attachment;
6 *provided, however,* that such lien shall not continue
7 after the bark or wood has arrived at a market.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
