STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT to Provide for the Appointment of Stenographers as Commissioners to take Depositions and Disclosures of Trustees.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. The Governor, with the advice and 2 consent of the Council, may, upon the written 3 recommendation of any judge of the supreme 4 judicial court, appoint competent stenographers 5 of either sex, as commissioners to take depositions 6 in all cases and disclosures of trustees.

SECT. 2. Such commissioners shall qualify by 2 taking the usual oath of office. They may act 3 throughout the State, and shall hold office for four

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4 years, and shall pay the same fees for their com-5 mission as are now paid by justices of the peace.

SECT. 3. They shall have and exercise the same 2 powers in taking depositions and disclosures of 3 trustees as are now exercised and possessed by 4 justices of the peace.

Depositions and disclosures of trustees SECT. 4. 2 may be taken by them stenographically by the consent 3 of the parties to the suit or proceeding, and their 4 notes shall be transcribed in full by questions and 5 answers and read to the deponent or trustee and If the deponent or trustee, in 6 signed by him. 7 writing, waives such reading, the transcript shall be 8 admissible as his deposition or disclosure, without 9 his signature. No change of, or addition to, the 10 transcript shall be made by the deponent or trustee, 11 except in the presence of the counsel who attested 12 the taking of the deposition. The commissioner 13 shall state the facts in his certificate, as to reading, 14 signature or waiver, and what, if any, changes or 15 additions were made.

SECT. 5. They shall receive the same fees for 2 travel, swearing witnesses, notifying parties and 3 deponents, as are now received by justices of the 4 peace, and in addition thereto, twenty cents a page 5 for their transcripts.
