STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Town of Frenchville,
Aroostook County.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred dollars
2 be and is hereby appropriated to aid in building a
3 bridge over the stream at Benjamin Bourgoins, in
4 the town of Frenchville, to be expended under the
5 direction of the Governor and Council, under the
6 condition that the town of Frenchville completes
7 said bridge.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The town of Frenchville, having quite an extraordinary unbroken and mountainous surface with constantly large mileage of new road to open and its many bridges to keep in repair. That the means of the inhabitants are very limited, and that nearly one-half of them are squatters on proprietors' lands. That said town needs an appropriation in aiding to rebuild a bridge near Benj. Bourgoin and dredging a ledge near Joseph Vaillancourt, which absolute necessity demands for the public safety.
