## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT additional to chapter seventy of the Revised Statutes, relating to the Discharge of Insolvent Debtors.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The debtor shall forever after the obtaining his 2 certificate of discharge, be forever discharged and

- 3 exempt from arrest or imprisonment in any suit,
- 4 or upon any proceeding for or on account of any
- 5 debt or demand which may have been provable
- 6 against his estate and due to any person or persons
- 7 not resident in this State at the time of the first pub-
- 8 lication of the notice of the issuing of the warrant,
- 9 or founded on a contract existing at the time of

10 said first publication and made or to be performed 11 out of the limits of this State; but the foregoing 12 provisions shall not apply to any debtor who has 13 received a discharge prior to the time when this 14 act takes effect.
