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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND  
EIGHTY-FIVE.

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AN ACT to revive section one, chapter seven, Public  
Laws of 1875, relative to the Citizenship of Persons  
Connected with the Soldier's Home at Togus.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature Assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. All persons who now are, or may  
2 hereafter become inmates of the National Home for  
3 Disabled Volunteer Soldiers at Togus, in the county  
4 of Kennebec, or subject to the rules and regulations  
5 thereof, or shall receive rations therefrom, shall be  
6 deemed citizens of the respective towns in which  
7 they had a legal residence when their connection  
8 with said National Home commenced, so long as  
9 such connection shall continue therewith.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
