STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT fixing the Compensation of Clerks of
Courts for attendance upon the courts.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Clerks of courts shall receive two
2 dollars and fifty cents in the supreme judicial
3 courts and the superior courts, and two dollars in
4 the county commissioners' courts, for each day's
5 attendance; *provided* that the amount of all fees,
6 including fees for attendance, received by each
7 clerk, shall not exceed the amount of his salary as
8 fixed by law. In counties where the clerks have
9 not a definite salary, they shall not receive fees for
10 attendance upon any court, except when necessary

11 to make the amount of his salary equal to one
12 thousand dollars.

SECT. 2. No clerk shall be paid for attendance
2 in person or by deputy, upon more than one court
3 at the same time.
