STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT exempting Masonic, Odd Fellows, and other fraternal relief associations, from the operation of the Statutes relating to Life Insurance.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Masonic, Odd Fellows, Knights of Pythias,

- 2 Knights of Honor, Royal Arcanum, Ancient
- 3 Order of United Workmen, and other fraternal
- 4 relief associations doing business upon the assess-
- 5 ment plan, which do not employ paid solicitors or
- 6 canvassers, or pay, or cause or allow to be paid,
- 7 commissions or fees for procuring membership
- 8 therein, or obtaining applications for insurance
- 9 upon the assessment plan, shall not be deemed
- 10 life insurance companies, under the laws of this

If any person receives a commission or 12 fee, directly or indirectly, for procuring an applifor membership in any organization 14 described in this act, or for insurance therein 15 on the assessment plan, he shall become liable 16 to the penalty provided in section seventy-three, 17 chapter forty-nine of the Revised Statutes, to be 18 recovered in an action of debt, in the name and to 19 the use of the State, to be commenced and prose-20 cuted by the Attorney General, on the request of 21 the Insurance Commissioner, but the payment of 22 officers of any such organizations, who perform 23 the official duties usually incumbent on secretaries 24 and treasurers, shall not be held to constitute them 25 paid solicitors or canvassers of such organiza-26 tions, and nothing contained in this act shall be 27 so construed as to prohibit said organization from 28 authorizing any member thereof to assist in the 29 formation of new organizations, and compensate 30 him for such assistance.
