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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND  
EIGHTY-FIVE.

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AN ACT amendatory of Sections twenty-one and  
twenty-four of Chapter seventy-eight of the Revised  
Statutes, and fixing the Compensation and Duties  
of County Commissioners.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature Assembled, as follows:*

SECTION. 1. Section twenty-one of chapter  
2 seventy-eight of the Revised Statutes is hereby  
3 amended by striking out the words "of the coun-  
4 ties of Cumberland and Aroostook" in the first  
5 and second lines, also the words "and each com-  
6 missioner for every other county two dollars a day"  
7 in the second and third lines, so that said section,  
8 as amended, shall read as follows, viz:

‘SECT. 21. Each commissioner shall receive two  
10 dollars and fifty cents a day while actually employ-  
11 ed in the service of the county, including the time  
12 spent in travelling, for which every commissioner  
13 shall have eight cents a mile for the distance actually  
•14 travelled, but no commissioner shall have more than  
15 one travel during the same hearing or session, or  
16 for more than two adjournments of any regular  
17 term; nor for service or travel on more than one  
18 petition or case at the same time; nor anything for  
19 travel or attendance at the Legislature connected  
20 with the annual county estimates; nor for any addi-  
21 tional trouble or expense.’

SECT. 2. Section twenty-four of chapter seventy-  
2 eight of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended  
3 by striking out the word “Cumberland” in the first  
4 line, and inserting the word ‘each,’ so that said  
5 section, as amended, shall read as follows, viz:

SECT. 24. At the end of each year, the commis-  
7 sioners of each county shall make a statement of  
8 its financial condition, showing in detail all moneys  
9 received into and paid out of its treasury, and such  
10 other facts and statistics, as may be necessary to  
11 exhibit the true state of its finances; and publish  
12 in pamphlet form, a reasonable number of copies  
13 for distribution among the citizens thereof.
