STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to abolish arrest and imprisonment for debt, except in certain cases.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. No person shall be arrested or im-

- 2 prisoned on any writ or mesne process in any civil
- 3 action or proceeding or on any execution or final
- 4 process issued on any judgment rendered in any
- 5 civil action or proceeding, except as herein provided.

SECT. 2. The prohibition of arrest and imprison-

- 2 ment in section one of this Act shall not apply to
- 3 any capias or other process issued to procure the
- 4 attendance of any person as witness, juror or officer
- 5 of court in any legal proceeding or to any inter-

- 6 locutary decrees or orders or to commitments for 7 contempt or to the accused party or respondent 8 in besterdy precedings under the Statutes of the
- 8 in bastardy proceedings under the Statutes of the
- 9 State or to the collection or disposal of public
- 10 taxes in any mode provided or to be provided by 11 law.
 - Sect. 3. No writ on mense process or execution
 - 2 or final process issued after this Act takes effect
 - 3 shall run against the body contrary to the provis-
 - 4 ions of this Act the right to attach and dispose of
 - 5 property or interest therein in any mode or modes
 - 6 is not hereby abridged or affected.
 - SECT. 4. This Act shall take effect and become 2 a law when approved.
