STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to further amend section eight of chapter twenty-four of the Revised Statutes of eighteen hundred and eighty-three as amended by chapter two hundred and sixty-nine of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section eight of chapter twenty-four of the Re-

- 3 as amended by chapter two hundred and sixty-nine
- 4 of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-
- 5 five, is hereby further amended by adding the fol-
- 6 lowing words to the end thereof, to wit: 'And

7 this section shall not be so construed as to de-8 prive overseers of the poor of any rights to re-9 move and support such dependent soldier and his 10 family, in like manner as they may now do in the 11 cases of other dependent persons,' so that said sec-12 tion as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 8. No soldier who served by enlistment 14 in the war of eighteen hundred and sixty-one, and 15 who has received an honorable discharge from said 16 service, and who has or may become dependent 17 upon any town, shall be considered a pauper or be 18 subject to disfranchisement for that cause; but the 19 time during which said soldier is so dependent shall 20 not be included in the period of residence necessary 21 to change his settlement, and this section shall not 22 be so construed as to deprive overseers of the poor 23 of any rights to remove and support such dependent 24 ent soldier and his family, in like manner as they 25 may now do in the cases of other dependent per-26 sons.'
