IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Section One of Chapter Twenty-Two of the Revised Statutes, relating to Division Fences.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section one of chapter twenty-two of the Revised

- 2 Statutes, is hereby amended by striking off the
- 3 sixth line of said section the following words "built
- 4 since April fifteenth, eighteen hundred and eighty-
- 5 three," so that said section as amended shall read
- 6 as follows:

'Section 1. All fences four feet high and in good 8 repair, consisting of rails, timber, boards, stone walls, 9 iron or wire; and brooks, rivers, ponds, creeks, 10 ditches and hedges, or other things which, in the 11 judgment of the fence viewers having jurisdiction 12 thereof are equivalent thereto, are legal and sufficient fences; provided, however, that no barbed 14 wire fence shall be accounted legal and sufficient, 15 unless it is protected by an upper rail or board of 16 wood.'
