STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT relating to the Employment of Teachers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The school committee, or supervisor 2 of any city, town, or plantation who have the hiring 3 power, may make a contract with any duly qualified 4 person for his services as teacher in the public 5 schools of such city, town, or plantation for any 6 length of time; provided, however, such person has 7 served as a teacher in the public schools of such 8 city, town, or plantation for a period of not less 9 than one year.

- Sect. 2. Either party to the contract formed
- 2 under section one may terminate such contract by
- 3 giving notice of such termination, of not less than
- 4 thirty days to the other party, except in the case of
- 5 inefficiency or ill behavior on the part of the teacher
- 6 when he may be dismissed without such notice.
- SECT. 3. The penalty for a failure to give notice
- 2 as provided in section two of this act, shall be
- 3 equal to the wages of the teacher during the next
- 4 last thirty days before the breaking of the contract.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when ap-2 proved.
