STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Nancy M. Hill of East Machias.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury

- 2 of the State, to Nancy M. Hill of East Machias,
- 3 the sum of thirty dollars per month during the
- 4 pleasure of the Legislature, commencing January
- 5 first, eighteen hundred and eighty-seven.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Lyman O. Hill, late of East Machias, a game warden of this State, was murdered near Fletcher Brook, on the Machias River, on the eighth day of November, 1886, while in the performance of his duty as an officer of the law. Said Lyman O. Hill was a soldier in the war of the rebellion, in Company "H," Ninth Regiment Infantry, Maine Volunteers, and lost an arm in the service, for which he was pensioned by the United States Government. His widow, Nancy M. Hill and five children survive him, and are homeless and penniless, and with no means of support.
