STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Fort Kent.

Resolved, That the State Treasurer be directed to 2 pay to the town of Fort Kent the sum of one hun-3 dred forty-two dollars forty-two cents (\$142.42) 4 being the balance in equity due said town as its 5 proportion of school money for the year eighteen 6 hundred and eighty-six.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

In 1885, the whole number of scholars was 760. In 1886, 774. The return from the town was made and mailed, but not received, and hence the sum of \$142.42 was lost to the town and this but restores the amount of school money which the town would have received if the return had not been lost.
