STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend chapter two hundred and eighty of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five, entitled "An Act amendatory to section twenty-nine" of chapter ninety-one of the Revised Statutes."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section twenty-nine of chapter 2 ninety-one of the Revised Statutes, as amended by 3 chapter two hundred and eighty of the Public 4 Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five, is 5 hereby further amended by adding after the word 6 "peeling," in the first line of said section, the

7 words 'or yarding;' and by adding after the word 8 "wood," in the second line, the words 'or at cook9 ing for persong engaged in such labor;' and by 10 adding after the word "services," in the third line, 11 the words 'and the services performed by his 12 team,' and by adding after the word "days," in the 13 fourth line, the words 'after the contract is com14 pleted,' so that said section as amended shall read 15 as follows:

'Sect. 29. Whoever labors at cutting and peel14 ing or yarding hemlock bark, or cutting cord
15 wood, or at cooking for persons engaged in such
16 labor, has a lien thereon for the amount due for his
17 personal services and the services performed by
18 his team, which takes precedence of all other
19 claims, continues for thirty days after the contract
20 is completed, and may be enforced by attachment;
21 provided, however, that such lien shall not continue
22 after the bark or wood has arrived at a market.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when ap-2 proved.
