RESOLVE in favor of Hamlin Plantation.

Resolved, That two hundred dollars be and hereby

- 2 is appropriated to aid Hamlin Plantation in re-
- 3 building a bridge across Hammond Brook in said

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Hamlin Plantation, in Aroostook County, has an assessed valuation of about \$40,000. This plantation already maintains and keeps in repair eight bridges, all of which are on the mail route and county road, from Fort Fairfield to Van Buren in said county. Three of these bridges cost, when built, about \$400 apiece. Besides the State, county, school and plantation taxes, amounting to abount \$545 annually, this plantation supports at the Insane Hospital a patient at an annual cost of about \$175. The bridge asked for in the above resolve lies across Hammond Brook, on the main county line of travel, and must be re-built at once to accommodate and secure travel.
