Resolved, That six hundred dollars be and hereby

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Statement of facts, on petition of County Commissioners of Somerset County. This section of road embraces the mountainous divide between the waters of the Carrabasset and Dead Rivers. It is, like all mountainous roads, a hard rocky soil, with ledge croppings in many places. At this time it is badly cut up by water courses, with the bushes growing close to the wheel ruts, and needs more outlay than the inhabitants can afford. Over this road all the travel to the timber lands of north-western part of Somerset County, and northern part of Franklin County must travel. This is the route to Dead River, Eustis, Flagstaff, Coplin town, and the travel to Lake Megantic section, and is in importance a State road.
