## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend sections twenty-nine and thirty of chapter twenty-four of the Revised Statutes, relating to persons in unincorporated places needing Relief.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter twenty-four, section twenty-

- 2 nine of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by
- 3 striking out the words "and have not lived in the
- 4 town furnishing them relief," in the thirteenth line
- 5 of said section, so that the whole section when
- 6 amended, shall read as follows:
- 'SECT. 29. Persons found in places not incorpo-8 rated and needing relief, are under the care of the

9 overseers of the oldest incorporated adjoining town, 10 or the nearest unincorporated town where there are 11 none adjoining, who shall furnish relief to such 12 persons, as if they were found in such towns; and 13 such overseers may bind to service the children of 14 such persons as they may those of paupers of 15 their own town, and may bind out persons de-16 scribed in section twenty-seven, in manner therein 17 provided, residing in such unincorporated place, as 18 if in their own town, and such persons shall be 19 entitled to a like remedy and relief. When relief 20 is so provided, the towns so furnishing it have the 21 same remedies against the towns of their settle-22 ment as if they resided in the town so furnishing 23 relief. And when such paupers have no legal 24 settlement in the State, the State shall reimburse 25 said town for the relief furnished, to such an amount 26 as the Governor and Council adjudge to have been 27 necessarily expended therefor.'

SECT. 2. Section thirty of chapter twenty-four 2 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by 3 striking out after the word "town," in the third 4 line, the words "in which they have never before 5 resided," so that said section as amended shall read 6 as follows:

'SECT. 30. When persons residing in an unin-8 corporated place, and having no pauper settlement 9 in the State, remove from such place to any town 10 and there need relief, and the same is furnished to 11 them by such town, the State shall reimburse said 12 town for such relief so furnished in the same man-13 ner and under the same restrictions as to the amount 14 reimbursed as provided in the preceding section.'
