## STATE OF MAINE.

**RESOLVES** in favor of the Miller Bill.

WHEREAS, The bill now pending before Congress, 2 providing for the extirpation of contagious pleuro-3 pneumonia, foot and mouth disease and Rinder 4 pest among cattle and for other purposes, affects 5 a leading industry of our State. Therefore

Resolved, By the Senate and House of Repre-7 sentatives of the State of Maine in Legislature 8 assembled, that the enactment of the Miller Bill, 9 so called, would be in the interest not only of the 10 cattle growers of this State, but of every con-11 sumer of meat.

Resolved, That the losses inflicted upon the cattle 13 industry during the last two years by means of 14 embarrassing inter-state and foreign quarantines

15 amount to a national calamity, and that these16 quarantines constitute the greatest existing ob-17 struction to inter-state and foreign commerce.

Resolved, That experience has shown that the only 19 successful way to deal with pleuro-pneumonia is 20 by prompt resort to heroic treatment and that the 21 quickest way is the cheapest way.

Resolved, That as the very existence of the most 23 considerable portion of the meat supply of the 24 United States is seriously endangered by pleuro-25 pneumonia, that the suppression of the disease is 26 not only demanded as a sanitary measure for the 27 protection of the health of our people, but also as 28 a measure of political economy.

Resolved, That the secretary of state be and is 30 hereby directed to forward an authenticated copy 31 of the foregoing resolutions to the President of the 32 Senate and the Speaker of the House of Repre-33 sentatives in Congress assembled, with a request 34 that the same be laid before their respective bodies.
