STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Sandy River Plantation.

Resolved, That the sum of two thousand dollars

- 2 be and hereby is appropriated in aid of building a
- 3 road up the Sandy River Valley, from Madrid to
- 4 Sandy River Pond in Franklin County, to be ex-
- 5 pended under the direction of the County Commis
- 6 sioners of Franklin County.

This road, located in October, 1866, and an appropriation of \$2000 made to aid in its building by the Legislature of By reason of irregular proceedings of the County Commissioners the road was discontinued and the appropriation was not drawn. In consequence of the large and constantly increasing amount of travel to and from the noted Rangeley Lake region which must necessarily pass over this road, leading as it does through two nearly uninhabited plantations, and as now travelled subjecting all travel to the great inconvenience of surmounting a very long, high and steep hill, at times accompanied with danger, the County Commissioners have deemed it necessary to relocate this road, leading around said hill, and in consequence of the large expenditures of Franklin in building county buildings and large debt incurred thereby, the State is asked to reappropriate the sum of \$2000 in aid of building the road.
