STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section thirty-three of chapter
sixty-three of the Revised Statutes, relative to com-
pensation of witnesses before Probate Courts.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section thirty-three of chapter sixty-
2 three of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended
3 by inserting after the words "one dollar" in the
4 sixth line thereof, the words 'and fifty cents,' so
5 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'SECT. 33. Appraisers of estates, commissioners
7 for examining claims against insolvent estates or
8 determining disputed claims, and commmissioners
9 appointed to make division of estates and for as-

10 signing widows' dower, may be allowed a reason-
11 able compensation for the time actually employed,
12 including travel and expenses. Witnesses to the
13 execution of wills, or in any issue before the Pro-
14 bate Court, one dollar and fifty cents a day, and
15 six cents a mile going and returning; the fees of
16 witnesses to wills, appraisers and commissioners
17 on insolvent estates or disputed claims, shall be
18 paid by the executors, administrators, trustees or
19 guardians, and allowed in the settlement of their
20 accounts.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when ap-
2 proved.
