STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section twenty-four, chapter seventy-nine of the Revised Statutes, relating to the admission of Attorneys.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Chapter seventy-nine, section twen-
- 2 ty-four, of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended
- 3 by striking out in the third line of said section the
- 4 words "not exceeding twice in each year," so that
- 5 said section as amended shall read as follows:
 - 'SECT. 24. All examinations shall be public, and
- 7 in the presence of some justice of the supreme ju-
- 8 dicial court during term time. The time for hold-
- 9 ing the same in each county shall be fixed by the

10 Chief Justice. The examination shall be partly oral 11 and partly written, and be conducted by an exam12 ining committee of the bar in each county, to be 13 appointed by the Chief Justice. No candidate shall 14 be admitted whose examination or character is not 15 satisfactory to the presiding justice, nor unless 16 notice of the intended application is given in some 17 newspaper, by the clerk of the court to which ap18 plication is made, for thirty days at least before 19 admission. Every candidate must present to the 20 examining committee a written recommendation 21 from the member of the bar with whom he has 22 studied, and must pay all fees prescribed by law.
