STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Section Fifty-Five of Chapter Thirty-Eight of the Revised Statutes, requiring Pressed Hay to be marked with the name of the person owning same when put up, in addition to name of person putting up same.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section fifty-five of chapter thirty-eight of the

- 2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended by inserting
- 3 in the third line, after "same" the words 'also of
- 4 the person owning the same, at the time it is so
- 5 pressed and put up in bundles', and by changing
- 6 the words "person lives" in the fifth line, to 'per-
- 7 sons live,' so that said section as amended, shall

8 read as follows: 'All hay pressed and put up in 9 bundles shall have the first letter of the christian 10 name, and the whole of the surname of the person 11 putting up the same, also of the person owning 12 the same at the time it is so pressed and put up in 13 bundles, printed or stamped on bands or boards 14 made fast thereto, with the name of the State, and 15 the place where such persons live. Whoever offers 16 for sale or shipment, any pressed hay not marked 17 as aforesaid, forfeits one dollar for each bale so 18 offered, to be recovered by complaint. If the mas-19 ter of any vessel takes on board pressed hay not 20 marked as aforesaid, he forfeits one dollar for each 21 bundle so received, to be recovered by complaint.'
