## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to provide for a Bureau of Industrial and Labor Statistics.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- n Legislature assembled, as follows:

  Section 1. There is hereby established a sep-
- 2 arate and distinct department, which shall be called
- 3 the Bureau of Industrial and Labor Statistics.
  - SECT. 2. It shall be the duty of this department
- 2 to collect, assort, systematize, and present in an-
- 3 nual reports, to the Governor, to be by him trans-
- 4 mitted biennially to the Legislature, statistical de-
- 5 tails, relating to all departments of labor in the
- 6 State, especially in its relations to the commercial,
- 7 industrial, social, educational and sanitary condition

- 8 of the laboring people, and to the permanent pros-
- 9 perity of the productive industries of the State,
- 10 and also to enquire into the immediate causes of
- 11 strikes, lock-outs or other disturbances of the rela-
- 12 tions between employers and employes.
  - SECT. 3. The Governor shall, with the advice
  - 2 and consent of the Council, appoint immediately
  - 3 after this act goes into effect, and thereafter
  - 4 biennially, on the first Wednesday in February,
  - 5 some suitable person, who is identified with the
  - 6 labor interests, and who shall be designated com-
  - 7 missioner of industrial and labor statistics, with
  - 8 an office in such place as shall be designated by the
  - 9 Governor.
  - SECT. 4. The commissioner herein named, shall
  - 2 receive an annual salary of fifteen hundred dollars,
  - 3 and to aid in carrying out the provisions of this
  - 4 act, said commissioner is hereby authorized to
  - 5 employ such assistance and incur such expense,
  - 6 not exceeding five hundred dollars per annum, as
- 7 shall be necessary to carry out the provisions of
- 8 this act.
  - SECT. 5. The commissioner shall have power to
- 2 take and preserve evidence, examine witnesses
- 3 under oath, and administer the same, and in the
- 4 discharge of his duty, may enter any public insti-

- 5 tution of the State, and at reasonable hours
- 6 when open for business, any factory, workshop,
- 7 mine or other place where labor may be employed.
  - SECT. 6. All State, county, city and town officers,
- 2 are hereby directed to furnish to said commissioner
- 3 upon his request, all statistical information in refer-
- 4 ence to labor and labor industries, which shall be
- 5 in their possession as such officers.
  - SECT. 7. There is hereby appropriated out of any
- 2 money remaining in the State treasury the sum of
- 3 four thousand dollars for the ensuing two years for
- 4 the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this
- 5 act; the commissioner herein named shall receive
- 6 his salary in monthly instalments and the expenses
- 7 of the bureau shall be paid on the vouchers pre-
- 8 sented by the commissioner after the same shall
- 9 have been audited and approved by the Governor
- 10 and Council.
  - SECT. 8. Chapter one hundred and one of the
  - 2 resolves of eighteen hundred and seventy-three and
  - 3 all other acts and parts of acts inconsistent with
  - 4 this act are hereby repealed.
    - SECT. 9. This act shall take effect and be in force
  - 2 from and after its approval.
