STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Hannah Allen of Bath.

Resolved, That there be paid to Hannah Allen of
2 Bath, a pension of eight dollars per month, com-
3 mencing on the first day of January, in the year
4 of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-
5 seven.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Mrs. Hannah Allen had three sons who entered the army during the war of the rebellion. These sons supported their mother prior to their entering the army. Two of the sons were killed, leaving widows, thus depriving the mother from receiving a dependent pension from the Government. The third son was badly wounded and is unable to do any hard work and his pension is not large enough to give to his mother, who is 94 years of age, the care and support which she needs.
