IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section thirty-six chapter ninety-
nine Revised Statutes relating to Bail.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section thirty-six of chapter ninety-
2 nine of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by
3 adding thereto the following words: 'And any
4 person arrested on the Lord's day, or on the after-
5 noon or evening preceding, for aailable offence,
6 may be admitted to bail on that day by such com-
7 missioner;' so that said section, as amended, shall
8 read as follows:

'SECT. 36. Any person under arrest on criminal
10 process for aailable offence, may, before com-

11 mitment to jail, if he so requests, be taken by the
12 officer having him in charge, before such commis-
13 sioner who may inquire into the case and admit
14 him to bail. And any person arrested on the
15 Lord's day, or on the afternoon or evening preced-
16 ing, for aailable offence, may be admitted to bail
17 on that day by such commissioner.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when ap-
2 proved.
