STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section eight of chapter one hundred and fifteen of the Revised Statutes, relating "to Salaries of Public Officers and Compensation to Members of the Government."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section eight of chapter one hundred and fifteen 2 of the Revised Statutes, is hereby amended by 3 striking out the word "one" in the eleventh line 4 thereof, and inserting in place thereof the word 5 'two,' so that the first twelve lines of said section 6 as amended shall read as follows: (no change in 7 the remainder.)

Each member of the Executive Coun-SECT. 8. 9 cil shall receive the same compensation and travel 10 as a Representative to the Legislature, for services 11 as a Councillor during the session of the Council, 12 commencing in January and closing immediately 13 after the adjournment of the Legislature. 14 services at other sessions of the Council, each 15 Councillor shall be paid two dollars for every day's 16 actual attendance, and two dollars for every mile 17 travel, one way, from his place of abode to the 18 Capitol; and for authorized services on commit-19 tees, when the Council is not in session. Each 20 member of the Senate and House of Representa-21 tives shall receive two hundred and fifty dollars 22 for the regular session of the Legislature, and two 23 dollars for every ten miles' travel from his place of 24 abode, once in each session.'
